Bob Miller - President of the B.C. Angus Association

BCAA held a very successful weekend of events on Saturday, September 30 at Alex Fraser Park, Quesnel, BC. Approximately 38 members and visitors combined attended the Annual General Meeting which was comprised mostly of reports, introduction of the 2023 Breeder Directory & Handbook, presentation of BCAA coffee mugs to 25year members, a CAA presentation by CEO Myles Immerkar and election of officers.

Directors re-elected to two - year terms were Robyn Mumford, of Alexis Creek and Robyn Burt, of Quesnel. Morgan Lamontagne, Tomslake, BC was elected as the only new director this year with Todd Marchant stepping away after serving several years on the board. I wish to send a sincere thank you to Todd for his years of service, while also extending a welcome to Morgan. It will be geographically supportive to have a director from the Peace area on the BCAA board.

Immediately following the AGM, the inaugural Jackpot Pen Show took place. This event was met with great reviews, was well attended and supported with just over 60 head of cattle, 14 different exhibitors and approximately 60 spectators. The pen show was judged by a panel of three. Thank you to Myles Immerkar, CAA, Erin Kishkan, Pinnacle Limousin and Chad Seelhof, Woodjam Ranch, on an excellent job of sorting through some very difficult classes throughout the day. In many ways, 2023 has been a year of bittersweet for many beef cattle producers throughout BC. Drought and fire created a shortage of grazing areas and feed supply which led to high feed prices throughout the province in general. Some operations were forced to sell out after spending their life in the industry. That's the bitter. The sweet part may very well be the strong commodity prices for all categories of cattle going to market this year. Calf weights in general have been reported to be a little lighter, based on poor quality grazing conditions.

Did you know, that the Angus breed is having an impact on dairy corporations beefing up their dairy cattle. While dairy farmers have been using various beef bulls to produce surplus calves for a long time, the main recent shift has been towards more strategic selection of Angus beef sires. Many dairy operator's ambitions are to keep their priority of choosing Angus bulls with calving ease and short gestation length in addition to having sires with higher EPD's for growth and other traits such as muscle and carcass weight. It is reported that on a global level many dairy processors are turning to beef-on-dairy from a consistency of supply perspective. If the resulting offspring are bred well, fed well and managed well these animals can line up with the best of beef cohorts.

Did you know, Certified Angus Beef celebrates its 45th year since inception selling over 1.2 billion pounds in more than 52 countries in 2023.

Recipient: Woodjam Ranch c/o Ricky & Chad Seelhof & family. Horsefly BC.

History of Woodjam Ranch:

Chad and I (Ricky) both moved from Saskatchewan where we were both born and raised on mixed farms. We moved to BC in 2004. In 2007 we bought our first piece of land up river from the original Woodjam Ranch. This parcel tied perfectly into the rest of the ranch. At that time, we formed a partnership with Chad's parents Louis and Ellie. In 2014 Chad and I purchased the Woodjam Ranch from Louis and Ellie. We presently run 500 Angus cross mother cows.

Why Angus:

We use Angus at Woodjam because they are simply a good hearty cow. They are built tough for our country and climate. We love the maternal traits of the Angus mother. Our cows calve on bigger pastures so they must be self sufficient and as maintenance free as possible. We have tried other breeds but find the Angus to be efficient, a daptable and fertile.

Marketing:

We market our calves through TEAM action and BC Livestock Producers Co-op. We otherwise forward contract our calves or sell early to mid October online and then ship calves for early November delivery. Everything is weaned here at the ranch weighed directly off their mothers and shipped to their new owners the same day.

Replacement Heifers:

We traditionally retain approximately 100 replacement heifers each year. The replacements we keep will have strong Angus influence. We like them because of their maternal instincts, heartiness, and longevity within our operation.

Bull Power:

Woodjam Ranch bull power primarily consists of purebred Black Angus, some Red Angus and Angus / Simmie cross bulls. We are proud to say, 90% of our bulls are purchased in BC.

Ranch Management:

Our ranch is both Family owned and operated. In 2020 we were the recipients of both the "BC Cattlemen's

Association Ranch Sustainability Award" and the "Canadian Cattlemen's Association Environmental Sustainability Award". We are extremely honoured to have received both of these prestigious awards.





Allan passed away August 18 at Vernon Jubilee Hospital after a summer filled with family visits and loving care. He leaves behind his partner of 34 years, Cathy Glover, his daughter and the joy of his life Devon Smith, his stepson Dean Little (Kelsey) and his beloved grandchildren Mercer and Savannah, as well as his sister Anne Braund, nieces Catherine and Jennifer and nephew Kevin Braund and their families. He was predeceased by his parents Frank (1994) and Catherine (2009), sister Helen (2015), and his brother-in-law Peter Braund (2023).

Allan grew up on the family farm on Goudy Road in Ladner, graduating as his father did before him and his daughter after, from Delta Secondary in 1961. He worked for Delta Foam Board before investing in Richmond Plywood in 1966 where he retired as production manager (and number one on the payroll) in 2013. In his father's footsteps, he joined the Independent Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF) Delta Lodge 21 in 1961, serving as provincial Grand Master in 2009-2010. He continued to be an active member of Coronation #48 in Armstrong and Rebekah Excelsior #23 of Kamloops after moving to Enderby with Cathy and Devon in 2013. He relished his role as the unofficial patriarch and historian for both orders and truly enjoyed the fellowship he received right up until his passing.

Allan raised purebred Angus cattle in Ladner, launching his Aleden herd in 1972. The herd grew to more than 60 Red and Black mother cows by the early 90s and were visible from Hwy 17 between Ladner and Tsawwassen. He was an active member of the BC Angus Association and marketed his bulls at sales throughout the Southern Interior every spring. He was deeply honoured when the Canadian Angus Association commemorated his 50 year membership earlier this summer. He was a lifetime member of the Delta Agricultural Society, a member of Delta Farmers' Institute and the Canadian Red Angus Promotional Society. His ties to the beef industry in BC and the agricultural community in Ladner ultimately led to the purchase of *Country Life in BC* in 2016 with Cathy when she assumed the role as publisher.

Allan loved his cows, but he loved his family even more. He was a loving son and brother, a favourite "Unca," an adoring and very proud father and stepdad, a delighted grandfather and an "enabling" partner. He's touched all our lives in different ways and will be forever missed – in Friendship, Love and Truth.

Family will gather for Internment at the family plot at Boundary Bay Cemetery in Tsawwassen followed by a reception for all at his IOOF home lodge in Ladner, 5425 Ladner Trunk Road, on Saturday, September 16, 1-3 pm.







