## BC Angus Association Hosts Successful AGM & Jackpot Pen Show

BCAA held their annual weekend of events September 28 & 29 at Alex Fraser Park, Quesnel.

The weekend kicked off with the Kelsey 4-H beef club offering a lunch to Angus members, visitors and participants. BCAA made a donation to the club and thanked them for their involvement.

The annual general meeting was held at 1:30 pm Saturday with approximately 30 attendees, including a few joining via Zoom. President, Bob Miller chaired the meetings and welcomed guest presenter Kajal Latimer, Science & Technology, Canadian Angus, and special guest Ronnie Ford, current President of the Canadian Angus Association. Ronnie brought greetings from the CAA and spoke about raising cattle in the Maritimes where he resides. He also spoke about his travels across Canada visiting provincial members as the national board president and of the diversity and adaptability of the Angus breed.

Results from the election of officer's portion of the meetings saw long serving member John Appleby leave the board with Julie Anne Puhallo, Kamloops joining as the only new director elected this year. Welcome Julie Anne. Guest speaker Kajal Latimer provided an informative presentation referencing many Angus industry related subjects such as; submitting DNA samples, recommended use and availability of tissue sample units, ACE enrollment, CAA now accepting members data and required information via text messaging, the positive influence the Angus breed is having in the beef on dairy movement etc.

Exhibitors participated in eight different classes, with a Champion and Reserve Champion being declared in each class. # BCAA Commercial Angus Producer of the Year

**Nominee:** TOM & LORI KRANTZ – Tomslake, BC

**Ranch History:** We started in the cattle industry over 40 years ago with a small herd of 40 cows which consisted of black and red Angus. Today we breed 300 plus Angus and Angus influence females.

**Why Angus:** We have had good success using Angus genetics. Over the years we have stayed true to Angus breed through the industry trends. The Angus mother cow works well in our country for her mothering ability, her fertility and adaptability to feed and climate.

**Marketing:** We sell our steer calves annually through VJV Auction in nearby Dawson Creek. We feel we offer good reputation cattle. The buyers know and like our calves every fall.

**Replacement Heifers:** We keep all of our heifer calves over the winter, grass them throughout the summer, then select our replacements. We raise all of our own replacement cattle.

**Bull Battery:** (Black and /or Red Angus – 50% must be purchased in BC) We currently are running approximately sixteen black Angus bulls, which we purchase from local breeders in the Peace area.

**Ranch Management:** We grow and produce all of our feed. Operate with a 12,000 acre grazing lease. Background approximately 250 calves for summer grazing, of which we sell as grass yearlings in the fall.

We also have a full vaccination and herd health program.

# 2024 Cariboo Classic Steer and Heifer Show Report

The Cariboo Classic Society was formed in 2022, out of a desire to provide youth an opportunity to exhibit their livestock at a premier event, where Junior Association and 4H members ages 7-21 years can come together to compete, learn and create lifelong friendships and memories.

This prestigious event takes place in early June annually in Williams Lake, BC at the BC Livestock Producers Co-op sale yard facilities. In 2022 approximately 100 youth members and 140 head of steers and heifers participated. Fast forward to 2024, this show is gaining momentum as an amazing 175 exhibitors and 250 head of cattle combined to make this years Classic the main event for juniors in BC.

Much needed rainfall fell in Williams Lake on Day 1 of the Classic, this did not dampen the spirit and enthusiasm of the exhibitors, their parent families and the host committee.

Garrett Liebreich of Merit Cattle Co, Radville, Saskatchewan served as judge for the two-day event, judging showmanship on day 1 and professionally sorting through twelve classes of yearling heifers and steers respectfully on day 2.

3000 head of primarily Angus and Angus influence feeder steer and heifer calves were in strong demand for the annual “Special Angus Influence” sale.

**Chris & Dawn Armes** had their 748 lb. black Angus steer calves bring \$3.61 / lb. **Chris & Claire Jones** saw their 624 lb. s/c sell at \$3.94 / lb. and their 587 lb. h/c trade at \$3.54 / lb.

**Tom & Linda Hancock** saw their 500 lb. s/c notch 44.34 / lb. **Pam Blain & Bruce Donaldson** has 630lb s/c hit \$3.89 / lb. while their lighter weight 536 lb. steers traded at \$4.08 / lb.

**Rose Ranch** had 589 lb. black hided s/c hit \$4.04.50 / lb. and their 402 lb. steers top at \$4.92 / lb.

Summary: the two high selling bred heifers sold for \$105,000 each. Both were both daughters of the famous Brooking Dusty Countess 9026 donor dam.


Both heifers carried a breeding service to KT Gravity 3233, high selling bull in KT's spring bull sale.






