

Thomas Wildman and I were given the incredible opportunity to travel down south to Wooster, Ohio for the Certified Angus Beef (CAB) Forum in December. Beef enthusiasts

gathered from across America to come learn at the CAB headquarters and culinary centre, aging from senior year in high school to graduate students in their final year. I loved getting to know everyone, and hearing what they enjoyed about their school program and their passions in different sectors of the beef industry. We were there for less than 48 hours, and the variety of informative sessions and delicious meals we received in that time was impressive!!

First, we were given a tour of all of the CAB buildings - The culinary centre is state of the art and the perfect place to facilitate beef industry learning! It was a walk across the street from our hotel, and had a beautiful dining room, kitchen, and common area space. We got to walk through the warehouse and offices as well, and it was neat to see how many jobs they can complete from one building. The day we toured they were filming YouTube videos in a film kitchen, and they explained some of their marketing strategies and activities they do with their company. They made a commercial last year that got a lot of hits on YouTube that we watched together - which was a video of Certified Angus Beef being cooked and served on the side of a mountain! Search High Steaks commercial with Chef Ashley and Joel McHale on YouTube, it's pretty cool.

We then joined Dr. Daniel Clark in the meat lab, where we played a game to learn about carcass cutout values and guessed the prices and percentage division of a carcass with our teams. We learned the 10 requirements that make up the CAB certifications that a beef animal has to meet to be branded.

These are very specific requirements, with marbling being the biggest limiting factor. It is a highly heritable trait, but it depends other factors as well like nutrition, health, proper handling to prevent dark cutters, and a focus on genetics. There are at least 100 different brands of beef offered in grocery stores across the USA, and over 80 of them have "Angus" on that label. I knew the differences between grades and prime before and now I have a better understanding of how these businesses label meat products to their advantage. Just because it says "American Angus Beef" doesn't mean it's AAA! There was a carcass in the lab for us to get a visual, which helped us understand how the marbling, size, and colour affect what meat gets the CAB label and why. We even got to break down and cut into a Certified Angus Beef top sirloin!

Next, we heard from Diane Clark (Daniel's wife) and covered consumerism trends, from changing margins between ranchers and retail, to different trends with percentages that surprised all of us. She left us with a piece of advice - "Everything you do decreases or increases your credibility!" This left us feeling aware of why CAB cares so much about their marketing, as well as being more mindful about ourselves in situations.

Chef Peter Rosenberg was a highlight of the forum for us. We enjoyed Chef Peter's expertise all weekend, as he prepared all our meals. We ate so many delicious steaks in the span of 48 hours, and got to taste test the difference between different grades of meat. His secret to making a scrumptious steak is all in the timing of cooking the steak, and how long to let it settle. His go to seasonings? Simply salt and pepper. He has cooked for the Queen and a few presidents, and made us feel like royalty for our entire stay. He had some great stories to share with us.

The forum was great in terms of professional development as well, as Marlene Eick guided us in a session about etiquette in social situations. There were so many small

details I had never thought about before. She stressed always holding your drink in your left hand so you have your right hand to greet people, and she demonstrated how to initiate meeting someone for the first time in a professional and friendly fashion that



reduces awkwardness. This was fun to watch as she used us youth as her examples for what to do and what not to do! She revealed her tips and tricks- if she was attending a banquet with great networking opportunities and appetizers, she will purposely eat a big meal beforehand so her focus was all on meeting people and building connections instead of eating. The session made us feel ready to be more confident and credible in stressful business situations. Everyone at the Forum was friendly and fun, and we met beef enthusiasts from across the country. We hope to see them again someday at an Angus event in the future.

Thank you to the Canadian Angus Foundation and Association for making this possible. It was a well-organized event with great sessions and mentors. We had such a blast and want to encourage our fellow members to get more involved in the Angus breed too. Take every opportunity you can to step out of your comfort zone, expand your skills, and make new friends. It was a couple of days we'll never forget!

While our beloved 'Blue Knight' did not win the competition, I think it is safe to say that the Canadian Junior Angus crew was the loudest cheering section! When we returned to the hotel we heard from the CJA President, Hillary Sauder on opportunities available to Junior Angus members, Keely Adams the CAF Junior Ambassador on her activities over the last year and listened to the retiring director speeches, then it was off to the hotel pool to finish up the night.

On our final day of GOAL Conference, Amanda Hammell from RBC started things off. She talked about one of the most important aspects of ranching and farming, financials. Amanda shared with the Juniors how to have a strong credit score, some financial ratios, and ways to avoid excessive debt.



Jaclyn Horenberg shared about the organization, Beef Farmers of Ontario and what they do for their producers and the industry, noting that each province has a 'sister' organization to theirs that works for cattle producers, lobbying and advocating for the industry. She also highlighted the differences in farming in Ontario compared to other provinces across Canada.

Crystal Mackay of Loft 32 was our last speaker of the weekend, but for me one of the best. She shared the importance of interacting with our consumer's, and how to act to approach a conversation with people who share different views than you on the beef industry. This was a great topic to hear and learn about; we are all getting started in the industry and some of us may not have faced these conversations yet, so to learn how to approach them was very applicable.

Some highlights for me from this year's GOAL Conference was meeting and interacting with every Junior there through seating arrangements, games, group assignments, the pool party, and the medieval dinner. One of my favorite moments was designing a bull sale advertisement with a group of Juniors that I had never met before, yet by the end of the assignment we were able to have a comfortable conversation that would have never happened otherwise. Making memories at these events and outside of the conference is also so important. I will always remember going into downtown Toronto, before the conference began, with my sister and the American delegate to visit the CN Tower and Ripley's Aquarium. It was a weekend full of great experiences and memories I will never forget. ■

The Canadian Angus Foundation was incorporated in 1993 and is the charitable arm of the Canadian Angus Association.

The Junior Angus Stockman of the Year award was developed to recognize those outstanding young cattlemen who are constantly growing their 'stockmanship' capability by actively working with their Angus cattle; with actual farm involvement in day-to-day care of their livestock; learning the pedigrees and being actively involved in some breeding decisions within their operation; promoting their operation and cattle to the public through various and diversified means; growing their knowledge of nutrition, genetics and breeding; producing, selling and supporting demonstrable, reputable, notable, superior quality cattle; and understanding the relationship between our purebred Angus business and the commercial cattle and beef industry from the cow/calf producer through to the retail consumer experience. Five finalists will be selected from the nominations and will each receive \$250. 

- In-person Entry Fees: \$60/participant plus \$10 per conformation class before June 1, Late Entry Fee: \$100/participant plus \$20 per conformation class after June 1. The participant flat fee includes entry into all competitions (including VIRTUAL competitions but excluding conformation), show clothing and the scheduled meals. Please note that you must participate in a minimum of 4 competitions in order to show INCLUDING one VIRTUAL event.
- Virtual ONLY Entry Fee: \$25/participant and does NOT include show clothing or meals, etc.
- Animals may be entered in a maximum of one class except 2023 calves and animals entered in the Peeewe Division. 2023 calves are eligible to be entered in pair classes and calf classes. Animals shown in the Peeewe Division are eligible to be shown by another junior in a different division, provided the animal qualifies.
- There is no limit to the number of entries per member. Use one form per participant. All entries must be shown by the entrant and adult or non-entrant participation is forbidden.
- Show open to C/JA members. If you require your membership please send payment with your entry fees.
- Copies of the animal's registration papers must accompany entry.
- Alcohol & drugs are prohibited in the barns for the duration of the show.
- See detailed rules for descriptions of the following VIRTUAL competitions (to be submitted by July 10): Graphic Design, Literature and Photography, Email to canadianjunior.angus@gmail.com.
- Art and Scrapbook need to be submitted at the show.
- Marketing, Judging, Team Grooming and Angus Cookoff may all be entered at the show.
- Showmanship: All exhibitors are automatically entered in showmanship.

- ET calves that have been on a recipient cow can not be shown with genetic dam.


2024 Calendar Project
