Anyone aged 21 and under as of Jan. 1, 2023 may apply.


Applicants must submit an essay of approximately 500 words covering 4 main points.

Canadian Angus Association Parentage Verification Policy

Your Association and board of directors' goal is to help guarantee your genetics and provide bull buyers with the most accurate pedigree information possible. We can provide a SNP Parentage Verification test with double the number of SNPs so that our parentage verification is more accurate than ever. The requirements for parent verification on sires reinforces this.

The Canadian Angus policy on parentage verification states that:

All sires born on or before December 31, 2018 must have a DNA parentage profile on record with the Canadian Angus Association showing sire verification before their offspring can be registered.

All sires born on or after January 1, 2019 must have a DNA parentage profile on record with the Canadian Angus Association showing parentage verification (to both sire and dam) before their offspring can be registered. Sires being used for Al must be parentage verified (to both sire and dam) to the before they are granted Al approval status.

The Process

Record animal with Canadian Angus Association or in **Angus NOW**.

Setup a test request:

When doing registrations in <u>AngusNOW</u> add in your alternate sire's and choose PV or Angus GS test. NOTE currently you cannot enter requests in <u>AngusNOW</u> after the initial registration process.

OR Submit your list to the member services team via <u>email</u>. You can use the <u>DNA test</u> <u>request form</u> or send a list via email.


DNA paperwork will be sent to you - print the forms if emailed to you, request forms via fax or wait for them to arrive in the mail.

Please Note:


No matter how many hairs you provide, without roots, samples cannot be tested. The lab requires roots to complete DNA testing.

When collecting hair for DNA testing, be sure to collect from the tail switch and check that there are enough roots on each strand of hair. DNA is extracted from the roots, so a sample without roots is not fit for testing.

Report from Director of Business Development for MB/SK



As I sit to write this message, winter is taking one more swing at many parts of the prairies. Although the moisture is welcome in many areas, there are some that really are having issues with local flooding and roads being washed out. In my part of the world there really wasn't a lot of runoff or many pot holes filled up in the fields even though we had a good snow cover. Hopefully some warm rains will come along and get things washed off and the grass started.

The weather has also created a headache for many producers who calve on grass in April. It's made for some long days and nights of extra work caring for cold wet calves. However, along with the extra moisture and the strength of the cattle markets there is a real feeling of optimism out there for the cattle industry. All things seem to be pointing towards the strongest calf market this fall that any of us have ever experienced. The prices of open commercial heifers, breds and pairs has been pretty strong this spring as well as the price for purebred heifers. The bull sales, for the most part, have exceeded expectations. This may be due in part to the fact that many bulls found their way to town last fall due to the

feed shortage in many areas. The strengthening of the markets has had some producers decide to maintain or in some case expand their numbers which directly impacted sale prices. Whatever the reasons, things are looking pretty positive at this point.

Many will have market animals they are selling so if you can help them along in any way, they would appreciate the support. Along with these events there are a few other things happening that you might be interested in attending.


Hi Everyone! Many of you may know me as Lacey Dekeyser. Myself, along with my husband Ryan and

daughter Bentley, run Ramrod Livestock.


We are Black Angus Seed Stock Producers and have a few Simmentals.

Our introduction to the Red Angus breed was the inclusion of the Red Power Angus breeders bull testing program to our feed pens. Doug has remarked many times that the bull calves coming to the test station always weighed 100 pounds more than they looked.

The first Red Angus female was purchased at the Keystone Klassic sale in 1998 and JAS Red Angus was born. Two more bred heifers were bought from Danny Menzies when the first heifer was picked up at his farm. The next year heifers were bought from Botany Angus, Tatton Red Angus and Girvinmere Red Angus. The cow herd has grown overtime, and is now around 200.

Cattle have been shown at Brandon and Regina in past years and have been in sales at the Keystone Klassic, Agribition and Red Roundup.

Son Jason and wife Leslie have taken over the reins and are the fourth generation of McLaren's on the farm.

An annual bull sale was started in 2004 and our 2023 sale on the first Tuesday in April will be our nineteenth sale. This past fall it was decided to have our first female sale the "sisters" sale on December 12th to showcase and present the female side of the bulls we sell.

As all purebred producers know we cannot survive without our loyal customers who support our business. We also would not be able to continue without the support and encouragement of our families ,our friends and our neighbours to whom we are forever grateful.






